

Proverbs 6:22: Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.

Training Vs. Education; As Seen Through the Eyes of Humanist **Educators**

Humanist educator T. Robert Bassett in his book, Education For The Individual: A Humanistic Introduction, written primarily for college students taking education courses, takes issue with the standard traditional view that training a child and educating a child constitute basically the same thing.

Train (Noah Webster's 1828 Dictionary) - to educate; to teach; to form by instruction or practice.

T. Robert Bassett in the preface to Education For The Individual: "Any attempt to use schools for specific ulterior purposes (moral, social, political, economic) fails. because education is by nature incapable of

Psalm 18:43b,44 – "...Thou hast made me the head of the heathen: a people whom I have not known shall serve me. As soon as they hear of me, they shall obey me: the strangers shall submit (give feigned obedience) themselves unto me."

Psalm 66:3b, 7a - "...Through the greatness of thy power shall thine enemies submit (give feigned obedience) unto thee....He ruleth by his power for ever."

In the coming Millennium, Jesus Christ will rule by His <u>power</u> with a rod of iron. This righteous power will cause all the enemies of Christ to submit and all the righteous to rejoice. There will be no disappointments for the people of God, as so often is the case in the decisions of men in this corrupt age. Ω



MISSIONS TRIP TO INDIA

Recently, I had the opportunity to travel with Rev. Ric Hurd of International Partnership Ministries to the South India Baptist Bible College & Seminary in Coimbatore, India. It was our privilege to spend eleven days in the country of India visiting and preaching at various fundamental churches in the Indian states of Kerala, Tamil-Nadu, and Karnatacha.

While in India, I had the privilege of preaching at two "wedding engagement" services. This was a unique opportunity to preach through an interpreter to a number of Hindu families gathered there for the "engagements," and two visiting Hindu men made professions of faith in Christ at the Grace Tamil Baptist Church, where one of the services was held.

Dedicated Students

Our primary ministry, however, was to the students of SIBBC&S. The students and faculty of the college were a tremendous blessing to our hearts. Over 700 students crowded into the Chapel hall twice a day to sing praises to the name of Jesus Christ and hear His Word proclaimed. The students sat attentively for nearly two hours at each chapel and church service in the stifling subcontinent heat characteristic of Southern India to hear God's

Word preached. Many of these students came from very poor backgrounds and did not have the money even to pay the \$25. registration fee for college. We met several students who came from as far away as Myanmar, Nepal, Bhutan, Bangladesh, and Thailand.

Godly Discipline

The founder and president of the college, Dr. P. D. Cherian, is a strong disciplinarian who runs a tight ship. Much is expected and required of each student. The students have very little in material possessions or comforts (no air-conditioning or fans, no and no Starbucks): showers, however. the lack of these comforts does not hinder their spirits or their studying. Because of the leadership of the school and their remote location, they have little of the distractions of this vile world's culture and entertainment to allure them as students do here in the States. In my opinion, they possess a zeal for the Lord that is lacking among our Bible College students. Every night around 9:00 until 10:00 PM we would watch as students filed out of their dorm rooms to go to classrooms on campus or gather around a flashlight in the street when the power was out to meet together for prayer and Bible reading. They did so without prompting or coercion. What a

refreshing time it was to witness the hand of God working in those young people's hearts and lives as they prepared for His service.

The Changing Face of Missions

Schools like South India Baptist Bible College and [Seminary are preparing the next generation of Asian missionaries, evangelists and pastors. Most of the countries represented by the students who attend are closed to Western missionaries. However, 🛘 these Bible college graduates can go back to their native countries and because of their ethnic backgrounds can often get into other countries of Asia and the Far East to start churches, Bible Institutes, and Colleges. I am convinced more than ever that churches in America must undertake to support worthy native pastors, missionaries evangelists. It takes fewer dollars to support a strong, fundamental 🛘 native pastor or missionary in Asia or the Far East because of the lower cost of living and the exchange rates. It is time that pastors expand their thinking in regard to financially supporting missionaries. native Organizations such International Partnership Ministries, Frontline Missions, as well as Rock of Ages Prison Ministries have done a good job

Proverb Practicals

Proverbs 21:22, A wise man scaleth the city of the mighty, and casteth down the strength of the confidence thereof.

In this proverb, as in many proverbs, God provides us a word picture to help us with our learning. He wants us to picture a wise man who scales the walls of a city. He wants us to see that this man, who climbs the walls, is able to reveal them for what they are. The walls have been built for men to shelter themselves behind and thus to be protected from danger. The walls are to provide security for the people of the city. That is why people build walls!

Wisdom Scales the Walls

But here we have a wise man climbing the walls that men have built to show the people that they should not place their confidence in those walls. Why is this? What is God telling us here? How does this apply to us in these modern times of unwalled cities?

One of the main obligations of a preacher of the Word of God is to point people to Christ as the one and only Savior. The wise man knows that Christ is the one and only one in which to place his confidence for there is no other! But pointing people to a Savior presupposes their need for a Savior. It presupposes a misplaced confidence, if whatever they place their confidence in is not Christ.

These are the people who live in the city of the mighty as mentioned in this proverb. These are the people who are confident



in the strength of that with which they have surrounded themselves. These are the people who put their trust in the mighty workings of man, the cities of the mighty.

Weak Walls

What are the cities of the mighty? What are the cities that a wise man will climb to show that the walls are weak, to show that they are not worthy of confidence? Well, pride of life is a city that is trusted in; wealth is another city where the walls are high and strong. The city of power makes a man feel secure and provides walls which he thinks no one can penetrate. What about the city of self-esteem or the city of selfconfidence or self-reliance? What about the city of good works?

There are more cities in which man attempts to take refuge than we can imagine. From what cities do we seek protection? What cities have we built? In what cities do we place our confidence? Is there anything that man can build in which he can place eternal confidence, anything at all?

This proverb tells us that a wise man is not afraid to climb the walls of the city of the mighty and show those who trust in walls that those walls are not worthy of their trust. The wise man is to involve himself in the demolition, in the tearing down of those walls. The walls of the city of the mighty are nothing to the wise man. They present no problem to the wisdom of the wise man for wisdom is far above any mighty city.

One of the major responsibilities of a preacher is to scale the walls of the cities of the mighty and by wisdom, one by one, tear down those cities that men substitute for the only true city that is trustworthy, the Lord Jesus Christ. They are to tear down the strength of the confidence that men place in those cities. Don't be irritated when your pastor preaches negatively! Preachers are to be negative about the things in which men place their confidence and are to be positive about the city that God has prepared for His own.

The True Wall of Hope

They are to be positive about the only One worthy of our confidence, and they are to tear down all those things that keep a man from the true and mighty city, Jesus Christ.

The message of this verse appears again in II Cor. 10:4-5 — (For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God

(Continued from page 1—Biblical Training) giving a command performance to accomplish imposed ends. And it ought to fail, as I see it, because such uses of education violate personality by making pawns of people. That the outcomes of education cannot be predetermined holds...for the individual as well as society. Certain immediate results are attainable through training - the imparting or acquiring of particular skills - which should not be confused with education. I will argue that human beings cannot be permanently programmed by education, either for good or evil." (p. viii)

"The function of education, as delineated in this text, is to help students find self-fulfillment through the enrichment of their lives that learning confers." (p. viii).

- "...the way pupils feel in school is more important than anything else." (p. ix).
- "...the benefits of education, as distinct from training, are general rather than specific." (p. ix).

"It implies (his faith in humanistic education) an optimistic view of human nature and affirms a belief in the efficacy (effectiveness) of education as liberator — as distinguished from molder, mind controller, programmer, behavior modifier, or character builder" (Bassett's opinion of training).(p. ix). (Parenthesis mine).

The Bible View of Training

The Hebrew word *Chanak*, which is translated *to train* in Proverbs 22:6, is used only four other times, and each of those times it is translated *dedicate*. It means literally, to press in or on, and always speaks of something dedicated or set apart to God (through dedication or training). Deut. 20:5; I Kings 8:63; II Chron.

7:5. For the Christian, therefore, Biblical training describes the process of impressing the character and person of the Lord Jesus Christ upon the minds and hearts of the children we have the privilege to train.

Christian Training Vs. Humanistic Education

- I. The superiority of Biblical Training over Humanistic Education.
- A. Biblical Training desires and expects a predetermined outcome: "In the way he should go...."
- **B.** Biblical Training accomplishes a permanent result: "When he is old (of age) he will not depart from it."
- C. Biblical Training's purpose is to imprint the character of Christ into the child's life.
- **D**. Biblical Training requires dedication on the part of parents, teachers, and others who have a part in the training process.
- II. Important Qualities That Must Be Included In Biblical training.
- A. The Fear of God. "He will bless them that fear the Lord, both small and great. The Lord shall increase you more and more, you and your children" (Ps. 115:13,14). Children do not come into this world with this vital requirement for future salvation and service. Proverbs 1:7 - "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge." Knowledge is the fuel necessary for operating in this world; however, knowledge without the fear of the Lord puffeth up. (I Cor. 8:1). Wisdom, which is using knowledge aright in order to solve life's problems, follows. and then comes understanding, which is perceiving how things are going to turn out.
- 1. Webster's 1828 Dictionary "In good men the fear of God is a holy awe or reverence of God and His laws, which springs from a just view and real love of the divine

- character, leading the subjects of it to hate and shun every thing that can offend such a holy being, and inclining them to aim at perfect obedience."
- (Proverbs, 2. Charles Bridges p.3,4) - "The fear of God is that affectionate reverence, by which the child of God bends himself humbly and carefully to his Father's law. His wrath is so bitter, and His love so sweet; that hence springs an earnest desire to please Him, and because of the danger of coming short from his own weakness and temptations - a holy watchfulness and fear, 'that he might not sin "...Serve God against Him'!" acceptably with reverence and godly fear: For our God is a consuming fire" (Heb. 12:28,29).
- 3. George Lawson (True Knowledge-Proverbs, p.31) - This "fear is not a blind and tormenting passion of the soul, but a holy and delightful grace, founded in true apprehensions of the awful and lovely glories of the divine nature, and disposing him who possesses it, to walk with God. The knowledge of God regulates this fear, and preserves it from sinking into terror, or degenerating into superstition, but guides it to express its power in checking and subduing every corrupt affection, and animating the soul to every instance of obedience."
- 4. George Lawson (True Knowledge-Proverbs, p.32) "Experience, however long, observation, however close, human teaching, however skillful, can do nothing to supply us with true knowledge, without the influence of that Spirit, which rested upon Christ as a Spirit of wisdom and understanding, and which is given by Him to all His followers in their measure." (Matt. 16:17).
- **B**. How, then, can we train our children to fear God?

Academic "Super Heroes"

Mention the word *hero* and most children will rattle off a few sport legends or entertainment stars. While these men and women may have accomplished mighty feats of strength, endurance, or speed, there are many heroes found in academic fields that our students need to meet. In this day of the "super-hero," I would encourage you to designate a special place in your classroom to highlight a new type of "Super Hero." This could be a section of a bulletin board or even a poster board displayed on the side of your classroom wall. Encourage your students to look up information about scientists who loved God.

There are quite a few of these "super-heroes," whose Christian testimonies are very clear. Our students would be blessed to learn about Christians, who dedicated their lives to not only learning more about our world, but in doing so they were also able to learn more about the Creator Himself.

A few suggestions would include:

- 1) George Washington Carver the "Peanut Man," who lived a simple, sincere life, and who earnestly studied the Bible and sought God's wisdom while working on experiments.
- 2) Johannes Kepler German astronomer; studied planets in space.
- 3) Sir Isaac Newton English mathematician and natural philosopher; discovered gravity.
- 4) Galileo Italian astronomer and physicist.
- 5) **Friedrich Gauss** German astronomer and mathematician, who saw God's orderliness in our number system.
- 6) John Ray English naturalist and author of the book, The Wisdom of God Manifested in the Works of Creation. He wrote, "Let us then consider the greatness of God and observe the operations of His hands: let us take notice of, and admire His infinite wisdom and goodness in the formation of them."

Well, as you can see, the list goes on and on. It would be a shame if young people in our Christian schools did not learn about these true men of God, who gave glory and honor to the Creator and Sustainer of our universe. They are "super-heroes!" Ω

(Continued from page 6—Biblical Training) Hearing God's Word. "...Gather the people together, and I will make them hear my words, that they may learn to fear me all the days that they shall live upon the earth, and that they may teach their children" (to fear me). Deut. 4:10.

- 1. It is to be first taught by "Come, ye children, hearken unto me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord" (Ps. 34:11).
- 2. It is not likely to be acquired from parents if it is not observed first in their walk.
- 3. Purposeful training in the fear of God. The Bible passages that teach God's hatred of sin and show His wrath upon the disobedient should be read to the children and discussed, especially pointing out God's hatred for and judgment upon disobedience. This training must be accompanied by the in insistence obedience to you and the judgment that awaits their

refusal to obey. Fear of and obedience to parents' word is to precede fear of and obedience to God's Word. Below are listed some examples of God's judgment for disobedience and/ or lying to God.

- **a.** The man who gathered sticks on the Sabbath. Num. 15.
- b. Korah, Dathan, Abiram, and the others who rebelled against Moses. Num. 16.
- c. Achan and the accursed thing. Joshua 7.
- **d.** Uzza touching the Ark of God. I Chron. 13.
- serpents. e. The fiery Num. 21.
- f. Ananias and Sapphira lying to the Holy Spirit. Acts 5.

living and working abroad. The attacks against U.S. soil continued.

In April of 1983 a large vehicle packed with high explosives was driven into the U.S. Embassy compound in Beirut. When it explodes, it kills 63 people. The alarm went off again and America hit the snooze button once more.

Then just six short months later in 1983, another truck loaded with explosives is driven into the U.S. Embassy in Kuwait, and America continues to slumber.

The following year, in September 1984, another van is driven into the gate of the U.S. Embassy in Beirut and America slept.

Soon the terrorism spreads to Europe. In April 1985, a bomb explodes in a restaurant frequented by U.S. soldiers in Madrid.

Then in August 1985, a Volkswagen loaded with explosives is driven into the main gate of the U.S. Air Force Base at Rhein-Main, 22 are killed and the snooze alarm is buzzing louder and louder as U.S. interests are continually attacked.

Fifty-nine days later a cruise ship, the Achille Lauro is hijacked and we watched as an American in a wheelchair is singled out of the passenger list and executed.

The terrorists then shift their tactics to bombing civilian airliners when they bomb TWA Flight 840 in April of 1986 that killed 4 and the most tragic bombing, Pan Am Flight 103 over Lockerbie, Scotland in 1988, killing 259.

Clinton treated these terrorist acts as crimes; in fact we are still trying to bring these people to trial.

These are acts of war.

The wake up alarm is getting louder and louder. The terrorists decide to bring the fight to America. In January 1993, two CIA agents are shot and killed as they enter CIA headquarters in Langley, Virginia.
