There is a buzz word being bandied about in Fundamental circles today. That word is "balanced." Leading figures Fundamentalism are stating that "we must see a return to balanced ministries." Conferences are being held on "Biblical Belief and Balance." There is a real fear among these leaders that ministries may be unbalanced. There are several questions that have come to mind in relation to this fear. First of all, Is this fear legitimate? Secondly, Is this fear Scriptural? Thirdly, What do they mean by "balanced?"

# Dictionary Definition of "Balanced"

A quick look at the dictionary reveals that the word "balanced" means "matched, charged by equal weights; regulated so as to be equal; settled; adjusted; made equal in weight or amount; to

# BARABBAS' THEORY OF THE ATONEMENT

by C.I. SCOFIELD, D.D. (1843 -- 1921)

BARABBAS was condemned to die. No one has ever questioned the justice of his sentence. He was a rebel against the robber and a law. а And now the murderer. outraged law had laid strong hands on him, and bound, under lay sentence of death. He was not under probation, but under doom. He was not awaiting trial, but execution. Just before him, as his only prospect, was the awful death of

crucifixion. He knew what that meant; long hours of unspeakable agony, the hands and feet torn by great spikes, the wrists shoulder and ioints dislocated by the dragging down of the body. Each quivering nerve was a torture through tension, a burning, unquenchable thirst, and, all around, a jeering, taunting mob. All the horizon of his life is narrowed to that. The only question is, When?

# THE UNEQUAL YOKE

Yokes are very important in the Scriptures. We are especially warned not to be "unequally yoked together with unbelievers..." and with good cause. Our purity is especially tied to those with whom we are yoked for fellowship and service. Amos asked the question, "Can two walk together except they be agreed?" (Amos 3:3). The obvious answer to Amos' question is an unqualified "No".

# THE EOUAL YOKE

Obviously, if there is an "unequal yoke" there must also be an "equal yoke". I am afraid we pay little attention to this vital scriptural truth. Let us ask first what a yoke is and what is its purpose. A double yoke (the kind we are referring to in this article) ties two animals together for the purpose of accomplishing a greater purpose or a larger amount of work. Where the single yoked ox is capable of a given amount of power for pulling, two oxen voked together are capable of twice the pulling power and, therefore, a greater work accomplished.

### A SERVANT'S ROLE

The yoke is a means of accomplishing work. The raw power of the ox is changed from latent power to actual movement of the plow; work is accomplished. We are servants and will always be servants. We will never change that; however, we can change yokes. We can wear Christ's yoke and pull in an equal way with other faithful servants of Christ.

# The Age of Accountability

I grew up in the Methodist Church, where, at least in this part of the country, the age of accountability was generally considered to be age twelve. Two times in my youth I went forward in a revival to be saved. In the 1930's, I went from age six to age sixteen. In those days the Methodist Church still had some men who preached very strongly. Their messages were primarily against sin and were directed toward the older sinners and backsliders among us. Children

the altar, at least, that was my experience. The evangelist patted me on the head with some words of encouragement, but no gospel witness or even prayer was given.

# A Definition

What do we mean when we of the Age speak o f Accountability? Generally speaking, it is the age at which a child understands accountability to God; the age, we would say, when a child fully understands that he/she is a sinner and that their sin is against a holy and righteous God. The age at which a child understands that he/ she is a sinner. I think would also be the age at which a child could be saved; that is, understand that Christ died for sinners and that receiving Christ as Savior gives one eternal life. Every child is different, and the background and training of each child will vary. Some children may be saved at an early age, but not every child. I personally believe that some children may be in their early teens before they grasp the truths concerning their sin and what faith in Christ really means.

# Trapped Children

One of the most dangerous things we adults can do is to pressure children to receive Christ as Savior. It is my concern and contention that no one should be pressed to make a "decision" either for salvation or any other spiritual decision.

weigh by comparing (two arguments, two choices, two advantages, etc.)."1 In other words, by definition balance has to do with accounting and measurement.

# What do they mean by "Balanced"?

In my opinion, the concept of "balanced" has moved beyond the realms of accounting and measurement t o philosophical mood and attitude in relation to our approach to the world and its culture. The mood or attitude of "balance" seeks to measure out responses to all things spiritual from a *philosophical* approach rather than a strictly Biblical approach. The Scriptures and Truth always tip the balance in the direction of righteousness and never in the direction of error. It is my contention that the "balanced approach" being promoted is more concerned about what people think and feel about situations and issues that arise in the church. This concern is a misplaced fear on the part o f some Fundamentalists that in my opinion is not Biblically legitimate. "Open rebuke is better than secret love" (Proverbs 27:5). The Bible speaks with the

tilt of the scales toward the objective, the doctrinal, the solid foundation of truth and right. In this verse, open rebuke is not equal to secret love, but better. The strictly Biblical approach is more concerned about how God feels and what He has to say from His Holy Word about situations and issues that arise in the church. These are two starkly different approaches.

# An Example

By way of example, let's suppose that a fictitious Biblical Baptist Church has a deacon living in immorality. This, of course, is a serious breach of the Word of God that must be dealt with in a serious fashion. The pastor is now faced with a decision: Do you go after the problem deacon with philosophical approach (that is, based upon what people will think about pastor, the church, the deacon, the consequences) or will the pastor go after the problem deacon from a strictly Biblical approach which will deal with the deacon, his sin and the preservation of purity within the local church from God's point of view. Let's face it, God's point of view is not based on a "balanced" viewpoint. God's point of view based on TRUTH RIGHTEOUSNESS. God's view

is on the side of right. never middle-of-the-road. God did not send His only begotten to find a balanced approach to deal with sin. Hel sent His Son to die on Calvary's tree to redeem lost sinners and bring glory unto the Father. Christ dealt sin a death blow on Calvary. He forever took the stinger out of death and provided a way for lost sinners to come to the Father. There was nothing balanced about His Cross work. It was death to sin and life eternal for all those who repent and believe on the Lord Jesus Christ.

# Is the fear of "unbalanced" ministries legitimate?

If Fundamentalist leaders are concerned about men and ministries going off on tangents and rabbit trails rather than sticking to God's program then let them state their concerns clearly and not in veiled concepts. Dr. Bob Jones, Sr. preached powerfully concerning those who would run down the rabbit trail of love or the rabbit trail of some pet doctrine and leave God's trail. $^{
m I}$ We live in a day of tangents, especially in+light of the King James Translation controversy that is ripping the Church apart today. We can address these

# Planting and Watering

I Cor. 3:6,7 - I have planted, Apollos watered; but God gave the increase. So then neither is he that planteth any thing, neither he that watereth; but God that giveth the increase.

We plant; we water; that is all any of us can do so far as the child (or adult) is concerned. Our job then is to pray diligently and wait. Waiting is not something at which most of us are any good, but wait we must. We are not to play the numbers game but wait prayerfully for God to give the increase. It seems sometimes that we think that we are more interested in souls than God is. How foolish is that thinking when God the Father sent His only begotten Son from heaven's noonday to earth's midnight in order to save sinners.

# A False Hope

A child who makes a false "decision" for Christ is usually stuck with it all or most of his/her life. It is hard to convince them that they are not saved even when you and they see the rotten heart they still possess. Bad music, pornographic pictures, filthy stories, dirty and rebellious language, and love of the world are evident; yet they (and sometimes their parents) will still insist that they are saved. A genuine new birth will change all of that immediately. A 180 degree change of direction will take place when they genuinely repent and trust Christ as their Savior. I speak from experience concerning this change in the life of genuinely converted young people. The Old Gospel is still working. God's role is to work it: our role is to preach it.

One day when the crowd got hungry manufactured enough food for five thousand men, not to mention women and children, out of five loaves and a few small fishes. Because of these, and like things, perhaps Barabbas really was convinced that He was the Messiah, the Son of God. But he had not become His disciple, because he loved sin.

However, that may have been, it is easy to see that Barabbas had no need to be a theologian to form a good working theory of the atonement.

FIRST He knew that he was a guilty wretch, under the righteous condemnation of the law (Luke 23:25). And in both these respects Barabbas was a representative of all men (Rom. 3:10-20, 23; Gal. 3:10).

SECOND Barabbas knew that the Sufferer before him had done no sin (John 8:46; John 19:4; I Peter 2:22).

He knew that THIRDLY Jesus was, for him, a true substitute. He was verily and actually dying in his place and stead; an innocent and Holy Being bearing the very penalty which the law had decreed to iustly him. Barabbas. Whoever, in the coming ages, might question whether Christ's death was vicarious and substitutional,

he could never question it (II Cor. 5:21; Gal. 3:13; I Peter 2:22-24; 3:18; Isaiah 53:5,6).

FOURTHLY He knew that had done nothing merit the whatever to marvelous interposition of substitutional that Whatever may have been back of it, it reached him as an act of pure grace (Psalm 69:19,20; Eph. 2:4-9, II Tim. 1:9; Titus 2:11; Rom. 4:4,5).

FIFTHLY He knew that Christ's death for him was perfectly efficacious. There was, therefore, nothing for him to add to it. Just because Christ was dying, he was living. The only question before Pilate was whether Christ should die Barabbas. When it was decided that Christ should die, Barabbas was set free. His assurance was complete the instant that his Substitute said, "It is finished, ...and gave up the ghost" (John 19:30; Eph. 1:7; Col. 1:14; Rom. 5:9; I John 1:7; Col. 1:20; Heb. 10:10,14). John McNeill, the great Scottish preacher, well says:

"My brethren, let me commend to you Barabbas' theory of the atonement. It is a good theory to preach on, pray on, sing on, die on. Do you know any other theory that will stand the tests?"

Prov. 12:27 -- The slothful man roasteth not that which he took in hunting: but the substance of a diligent man is precious.

Lest you say you are not a hunter and, therefore, give little regard to this proverb, let me rephrase the message of the first portion in several ways. Perhaps one will catch you, for all of us are slothful in one thing or another!

# Ways of the Slothful

1) The slothful man eats not of the fruit of the tomato plants he bought but never planted, nor the food from a plowed but unplanted field, nor does he smell the flowers

from the seeds he bought but never sowed.

2) The slothful, undisciplining mother will not enjoy the children, which she carried in her womb, then suffered great pain while bearing

them. She sacrifices the effort of childbearing by not being rewarded with the pleasures of obedient children.

- 3) The slothful man lives not in the house that he began but never finished. His beginning efforts were wasted resulting in no blessing for himself or his family.
- 4) The slothful man through great effort develops a talent such as the playing of an instrument or voice development, yet never uses that talent for man or for the Lord.
- 5) The slothful man gathers all manner of money yet never puts to use that which took great effort to accumulate. Lifetimes are spent hunting for wealth, but the wealth is never roasted, never turned into

something that will bless. Money in the bank has no taste just as that which is hunted but never roasted has no taste.

# Marks of the Slothful

1) An identifying mark of the slothful has to do with a lack in turning a start into a blessing. The slothful man may start out successfully but has no staying power. He may be filled with ideas and activity but has not the character to execute the ideas and

extend that activity to a useful purpose.

God gives a short time to act on that which is taken in hunting and if not quickly roasted He takes back that which He gave. There are natural processes which provide opportunity to roast for just a short time. That

which is not roasted in the allowable time becomes unfit for roasting and for eating.

2) Another mark of the slothful is a lack of understanding that lost opportunity results in no further opportunity. Opportunity ceases to knock at a door that is unanswered, for it must be encouraged by acceptance, otherwise it goes elsewhere. Opportunity does not waste his time on the slothful! Did not Jesus Christ give us the parable of the talents? What about the lost opportunity of the slothful servent who hid his talent in the

servant who hid his talent in the earth? He had an opportunity to increase that talent for the Lord, but his slothfulness governed him to the

point of his hiding that talent in the earth. He chose the easy road but met severe rebuke from his master instead of honor.

3) Another mark of the slothful is doing or taking that which is pleasant but a rejection of that which is unpleasant. He gets excited about hunting but is not willing to do the dirty work to prepare the prey for roasting. He takes the good without paying the full price. The slothful man does the part of the work that he likes but rejects the part that is difficult.

Therefore, the slothful man is a waster of God's provision. The slothful man may plant the seed, but he refuses to cultivate, water, fertilize, prune, purge, pick, crush, or bottle the fruit. He is good at starting, but he is not good at finishing.

4) The slothful has a lack of understanding of the value of the substance and of the Source of that substance. The slothful does not understand that that which he took in hunting comes from God, and God expects all to be good stewards of that which He provides.

The slothful lacks understanding of the value of the substance and of the Source of that substance

The substance of a diligent man is precious, for he knows that substance comes from God and is the reward of the diligent. He

knows that which is taken in hunting is a reward from God for diligence and is to be enjoyed by

# Students' Rights

- I. Students have the right:
- A. To be treated fairly by the teacher and all other school personnel. To be shown respect at all times, not being subjected to threats, subjective evaluations, derogatory remarks or other forms of unethical or harsh disciplinary measures.
- B. To be respected as an individual with individual talents and abilities. To have the opportunity to develop those abilities in an atmosphere conducive to proper growth as a student and as an individual. To

- address their teacher or other school authority with an appropriate, "Yes, Ma'am", "No, Ma'am" or "Yes, Sir", "No, Sir" when spoken to.
- C. To obey the teacher's spoken word posthaste (speedily).
- D. To remain silent unless spoken to. They also have the right to follow "Due Process" (the teacher's established procedures for the classroom) when they desire to speak or to be otherwise recognized.
- E. To stand erect beside their desk and answer questions put to them by their teacher in a clear and audible voice, speaking in complete sentences, while

- showing proper respect to the teacher.
- F. To be expected to produce to the very best of his or her ability, yet not beyond that ability.
- G. To be truthful, not resorting to cheating, lying, stealing or other forms of dishonesty.
- H. To have the Gospel of the grace of God presented to them in a clear and unfettered manner, by a person of impeccable character.
- I. To be loved and prayed for in a consistent manner by those who are responsible for his or her development.

# Parents' Rights

- II. Parents have the right:
- A. To know that their child is loved. accepted and respected.
- B. To know that their child will be treated fairly, the same as every other child in the classroom.
- C. To know that their child will be given every opportunity to succeed.
- D. To know that people of character, Christians with a testimony within the community, will be role models for their children.
- E. To understand that their child is not always in the right. To get the whole story before they "fly off the handle."
- F. To let their child know that they stand behind the school and its policies and that they will not let the child drive a wedge between them and the school.

issues head on without changing our Biblical philosophy of ministry to do so. It is my contention that concern over "balanced ministries" is a rabbit trail, a tangent, rather than a solid Biblical course. This is a neoevangelical concept that has slipped in through the back door of Fundamentalism. Are we going to let it stay or send it outside?

# The Avoidance of Militancy

It is my fear that this concept of "balance" is in reality a cloaked disdain for militancy in the Battle for Truth. There are some men who have no stomach for confrontation and battle. When a Fundamentalist after an goes issue individual who is harming and hurting the cause of Christ, the first accusation against that brother is that he is not "balanced." Our Lord took a whip in hand and drove out the money changers who profane doing were а business in the Temple. Was "balanced" His approach? When Phineas

took the spear and drove it into the bodies of the Israelite prince and his harlot in the act of committing adultery, I ask you, was he "balanced" in his actions? When Samuel took a sword and hewed King Agag in pieces after Saul spared the king in disobedience to God, was Samuel "balanced" in his approach to killing the king? When Paul confronted Peter in front of all the Jewish leaders for his refusal to eat with Gentile brothers. was he concerned about "balance?" All of these Biblical characters were concerned about Biblical truth first.

# The Outcome of the Balanced Approach

Pulling punches for the sake of "balance" is deadly. Measured responses when we ought to be fighting to the death will not win the battle or the war. Our military is finding out in Iraq that when you pull punches, the opponent comes back to bite even harder. It is not my job to second guess our military leaders, but I have heard much about our pull

# **Security Blankets**

How sad it is, indeed, to see older children clinging to blankets, pacifiers, and other baby items. These children often exhibit such behavior because their parents have coddled them during their early years and have not provided a sense of security in their lives. Children need to be taught to put "baby stuff" away as they grow up. Teachers have a role to play in helping their students learn to become independent, capable children ready to face new experiences by setting a positive example. There are four basic principles that all students want from their teachers.

# 1) Students love structure.

This principle will develop independence by allowing every child to rest securely in the fact that his world will stay the same. A child can be comforted by the fact that his teacher is in control of every situation. Students want their teacher to earn their respect by taking charge of the classroom. Teachers should never worry about wanting their students to love them first of all. Love will follow respect. Respect can be won only by providing structure for your students.

# 2) Students want to get to know you as a person.

This is a frightful principle to new teachers but worthy of understanding. "Kids" read people better than adults do. They can spot a fake faster than any administrator can. Genuine servants of the Lord need not fear. Your love of the Lord should shine through your life and ministry. Your students will want to get to know about you and your life. Your students will need to learn that you care for them and will do everything in your power to give them the best Christian education possible. It is not important that they love you in return; however, it is important that you love them. In order for you to be able to discipline them, you must first love them. Love and discipline go hand in hand. This is another way we provide a secure environment for our students.

# 3) Students want to know everything that is expected of them.

We must be specific when we set up our classroom procedures and policies. Our pupils should never have to guess how they should do any assignment or how to act in any situation at school. The classroom teacher must set up the "how to's" during the first few days of school each year. This gives the students comfort and security as they go through their day.

# 4) Students want to know that you care about them as people.

Most students will do just about anything for the teacher who takes an interest in their lives. It is important for teachers to go to as many ball games, piano recitals, and other extra-curricular events as possible. We should have the attitude of cheering our students on in every possible way. We must let our students know that we are pulling for them academically, socially, and most importantly of all, spiritually. Our students need to be told that we will pray for their needs and are concerned about them beyond the classroom walls.

These four principles will serve our students well by replacing the "security blankets" of baby days. They will help our students learn to trust and rest securely in the fact that we are teaching and ministering in our Christian schools as a servant of the Lord Jesus Christ. They will set a tone for the coming school year and help school to be a happy, comfortable, and safe place. This tone will allow academics to be taught well and allow our students to leave "baby stuff" behind.

habits; any unusual drop in grades or deterioration of behavior.

# Teachers' Rights

- III. Teachers have the right:
- A. To know that their administration stands behind them in the carrying out of their many teaching responsibilities.
- B. To know that the parents of the students they teach will stand behind them in matters concerning the education of their children, that they can expect their cooperation, and that that cooperation is essential to the success of their child.
- C. To expect parents to give the teacher the benefit of the doubt in matters concerning the behavior and discipline of their children.
- D. To expect students amenable to voice obedience, that is, students who carry out the teacher's understood instructions without rebellion or delay.
- E. To expect parents to require them to be warm and approachable, not cold, aloof and unsociable. Parents develop trust when teachers show love and genuine concern for their child.
- F. To expect the administration to supervise their classrooms in a respectful but earnest manner, understanding that the administrator must know what is happening in each classroom as he or she has the ultimate responsibility for the total educational program as well as each individual child.

G. To know that their character. appearance and manner of life reflect upon the entire ministry of the school in which they teach. Their personal standards should be at least as high as the school's. Their behavior on and off campus must be above reproach at all times.

# Administrators' Rights

- IV. Administrators have the right:
- A. To have the full support of the parents who have their children in the Christian school
- B. To have the unreserved support of the pastor or school board, the faculty and the staff of the school.
- C. To be respected by the students and have them respond immediately and cheerfully to his or her spoken instructions.

- D. To know that parents, teachers and students have a right to expect that their leader will be a Christian of impeccable Christian character who is impartial in judgment and wise and prudent in making decisions.
- To know that parents require accountability on his or her part concerning the safety and education of their children.
- To know that the students expect their administrator to be fair and impartial in dealing with them in all circumstances.
- G. To observe the performance of each teacher under his supervision for the purpose of improving performance, both of the teacher and students. The time of observations should be staggered so as to observe the different segments of the day,

followed by a meeting with the teacher to go over the visit. recognizing the positive things observed as well as any improvements that may be Although some suggested. teachers may be nervous and not desire such observation of their teaching, the parents deserve to know that the administrator speaks from first hand knowledge about every teacher Observation ' and classroom. should be a positive experience for the teacher, one that is done with tact and a genuine interest in the progress of the teacher and student alike.
